From the Rabbi's Desk

We will soon read the proof text for the Mitzvah of our Grace after Meals. It appears in Parshat Eikev and states, "You should eat, be satisfied and bless God." This gives us the order of things. We give praise to God after we eat, at a time when it would be easy to forget Him.

Birkat HaMazon consists of four parts:

- 1) Birkat Hazan: Moses instituted the first paragraph of benching when the Jews received the manna in the wilderness. In this first blessing, we acknowledge that, even though human beings labor to secure their sustenance, nevertheless it is God who gives food to us and all creatures.
- 2) Birkat Ha'Aretz: the blessing over the Land. Joshua introduced this second part of the Birkat Hamazon. It was written when the Jews entered the Holy Land and serves as a benediction of the Land that brings food to the people.
- 3) Birkat Yerushalyim: The blessing of peace for Jerusalem. This part was written by Kings David and Solomon and petitions for the continuation of rulership of David's house and for peace upon Jerusalem and the Holy temple. After its destruction, the Rabbis amended the text to request that God rebuid the place of our central worship.
- 4) Hatov V'Hamaitiv: The Blessing to God who does good. This blessing was added by our Sages to commemorate a miracle in connection with the destruction of the Second Temple whereby the martyrs of the revolt were allowed to be buried with dignity.

We can see that the beautiful structure of the benching has evolved over the years based on Jewish history. We are instructed to give thanks by reciting the Birkat with joy, elation and proper concentration. In Megillat Ruth, we read that "Boaz ate and drank and his heart was happy." Why was his heart happy? He put himself in a happy frame of mind after eating, in order to recite the blessings wholeheartedly. We should try to do the same.

If anyone wants to learn the melodies of the Birkat HaMazon to fulfill this beautiful, daily Mitzvah, please call me!


